The team traveled all around Mbooni, kicking up the red dust that is everywhere. We met with many of the widows and they welcomed us. The kids were in school and there were COVID restrictions, but we were still able to connect with some of the teachers after school who referred a few more students to us that they felt needed help. The US team went with the vision of finding more orphans that needed assistance. The school itself is a long low building and each classroom has a door outside. There is a chalkboard at the front, and the desks are very simple wooden desks. No technology is available in this school's classrooms. The books are stacked against a wall and are used over and over again. The children learn just the same. We saw some of the kids as we walked through the area, all wearing those uniforms that Child Arise helps provide the students that are sponsored. Uniforms are required to attend school. School fees must be paid as well. While the team was still in Kenya, we were able to pay the fees for at least two more students who will now be sponsored by Child Arise. Without the fee, the children cannot attend school. Imagine not being able to pay those fees, or being the adult who has to tell the child there is no money for the fees. Imagine missing even a basic education and what the future looks like for that child. Through the efforts of our benefactors, through the hands and feet of Elizabeth, these children are given a chance to not just grow up and support themselves, but to learn about the love of a Father God who loves them.
